Course Description:

I aim to develop in young people an understanding and appreciation of the social sciences in order to help them make informed and reasoned decisions for the public good. As citizens of a democratic society in a culturally diverse and interdependent world, young people need to be able to examine complex issues. Students are expected to become active, responsible, concerned, and knowledgeable citizens (UEN).

In this course, students will become historians in training. What do historians do? HISTORIANS

Learn how to analyze information
See the relationship between causes and effects
Make sense of the past and connect it to the present
Learn how to communicate by making coherent arguments
Gain a deeper understanding of the world and of people

To practice being a historian, students will:

-Use academic vocabulary
-Examine primary and secondary sources
-Research and investigate events and time periods
-Use evidence to justify their opinion
-Connect history with current events

Grading:

In this class you will be graded on what you have learned. In accordance with the schools 80/20 policy 80% of your class will be based assessment, not all assessment will be tests. Grades in this class are a "work in progress," today you may not be able to analyze a primary source document at an "A Level" but at the end of the semester you will. YOU WILL LEARN HOW!!! Please see the attached rubric so that you know what "A" level work looks like. A's will be given to students who have 90-100% but only if all their work has been turned in on time. Otherwise a 90-92% will then be an A-.

- 5. Interpretation and synthesis of events and time periods (IAS)
- 6. Employability (time management, attendance)
