- 4. **NEATLY write 3-4 complete sentences** under the title of each stop that describe important and interesting information about the event and that **explain HOW** this led the Romans to self-destruction.
- 5. After you have designed your road map and your stops, **fill up empty space** by illustrating details related to each event, such as the problem or issue, the place, and the people involved.

- You have included all the events on the list.
- Events are labeled with name and are in sequential order.
- Each event includes 3-4 complete sentences and explains how it led to Rome's demise.
- Each invention has at least one illustration, and you have explained how the illustration represents the invention.
